Bill needs to get passed in both Assembly and Senate:

You and your representatives will present this and answer questions



Bill gets voted on by COSA:

Committee on Student Affairs is composed of staff and students and serve as a advisory committee for ASUU and the university



Voted on by Board of

Trustees: The U is governed by the Board of Trustees, appointed by the governor of Utah. They will only vote on issues with a monetary amount and Redbook changes.



PURPOSE

- Redbook (ASUU's Constitution and Bylaws) says that ASUU is made to:
 To represent the University's students regarding issues arising in
 - the University communityTo express student opinion.
 - To ensure participation and involvement in community concerns and affairs.

JOINT BILL

- A joint bill is for things that ASUU has direct decision making in
 Ex: ASUU Redbook changes, ASUU large budget requests, etc.
- Things that have been done before:
 - The funding and implementation of ASUU boxes for student feedback
 - Trying to change the voting process in the ASUU Redbook for elections

JOINT RESOLUTION

- A joint resolution is made to state student perspectives on issues, it is a call to action.
- Individuals work with whoever the resolution is addressed to in order to draft resolution (ex: if you are trying to get more counselors you would work with the counseling center)
- If passed, the respective organizations/individuals should began working together to take action on the resolution/perspective.
- Ex: Against the tearing down of a historic building, think the University should hire more tutors, supporting community groups in need, etc.
- Things that have been done before:
 - Resolution to build a campus skate park
