Accountability

Setting up a more efficient administration to handle student needs.

- Improve transparency across Student and Academic Affairs to increase the availability and accessibility for academic, extracurricular, personal, and professional development opportunities.
- Utilize proactive outreach to obtain input from all students on campus in shaping our policy agenda, particularly underrepresented groups such as non-traditional and graduate students.
- Elevate the voices of student leaders within the University to develop a comprehensive framework of student needs and bring issues to the attention of administration.
- Streamline University processes and student-facing services, with a focus on improving parking, student success programs, and academic advising.

Belonging

Setting up a welcoming environment for open dialogue among all student identities.

- Clarify and outline protections for student activism across a spectrum of ideologies on campus, and using our platform to foster academic and productive discourse and facilitate positive action-taking
- Make ASUU government participation more accessible for underrepresented communities and voices through external outreach and internal reform, with the goal of allowing ASUU to truly represent the student body and further address the unique needs of our student population.
- Continue a legacy of engaging, culturally rich, and justice-oriented programming at the University through initiatives and advocacy work, with an emphasis on fostering collaborations between various departments.

Campus Safety

Establishing a foundation of policy reform that addresses key student concerns.

- Advocate for the expansion and increased awareness of current student safety programs such as SafeRide to demonstrate their effectiveness in fostering a more comfortable and accessible campus climate.
- Opening up a consistent dialogue between the campus population and our safety offices to allow for students to have their safety concerns addressed in a quick and effective manner.
- Facilitating enhancements to the University's primary, secondary, and tertiary crime prevention efforts through engaging with experts, both on our campus (such as the Victim-Survivor Advocates and McCluskey Center for Violence Prevention) and in our community.

In the end, our aim is to unite our expertise and experiences to make ASUU a force for positive change within our campus. From ensuring accountability from university administration and inspiring meaningful action across the university, to creating spaces to celebrate and empower the people and groups that make the U what it is, we hope to bring your voices to the forefront and work tirelessly to *set* the course for a brighter future for our campus.
